



Q48 Describe any improved new facilities or services that you would like to see in the town.

- Improved signalised puffin pedestrian crossing
- The provision of a Performing Arts Centre
- More dog litter bins, only two along entire Canal Path, one on the common. Control of dog cleaning up. Canal Path can be disgusting at times. Increased facilities for boaters including rubbish bins - perhaps with BW key?
- Resident's parking in Church Street removal. Visibility when crossing road is poor - it's an accident waiting to happen
- Much better parking for cars and visitors
Restricted HGV traffic
Return of the Youth Service as a permanent presence in Hungerford
- More free parking to encourage visitors
- Wider variety of shops.
No more charity shops.
No more antique shops.
Zebra crossings outside schools.
Reduce speed in High Street.
More family centred events,
- Restaurants / coffee shops. I've had so many conversations with people about the lack of places to have a coffee / lunch in the town. We (and many friends) go to Marlborough or Newbury to get a coffee and then end up doing our shopping there.
The Tuttipole is outdated and Azuza is small / not great.
- Youth club to get teenagers off the street
- More out of school facilities for young
- Provide 20minutes free parking in town centre - so people can drop off and shop without being terrorised by traffic warden.
Would create a much friendlier feel
- Allow restaurants to use pavements
Reduce retail rents so people can afford to run a shop
Tidy up the buildings in the High Street
- Full time staff at Police Station with PC's and Sergeant
A cleaned up passenger welcoming station
A quality independent baker
- A pub with gardens opening onto canal / river
- Improved street lighting (e.g. 'School Alley' between High Street and Fairview Road
- Improved canal tow path surfaces to make this the cycle route of choice from Hamstead Marshall westwards. Route 4 is currently signposted via country lanes.
- Proper café/bar on the High Street, where you can sit outside. Proper playcentre for toddlers.
More activities or groups for teenagers and other age groups
- More permissive paths in adjacent countryside to improve circular walk opportunities



- Bistro / bar, fishmonger, decent haberdashery, free parking in High Street, remove parking bays below town hall in high street to widen pavements
- Restaurant & bar / decent coffee shop
- Seating at bus stop
- More for secondary school age children
- Encourage more people on foot and less traffic e.g. park & ride into Hungerford, in the hope it will reduce traffic congestion but encourage visitors
- Allow more respectable small well known franchise / independent cafes, bistros to be opened, i.e. Costa Coffee, Café Rouge, Ask Pizza, Chez Gerard
- Re-surface A338 through town
Remove roundabout at end of Priory Road
- More seats in High Street, Church Street (difficult I know) in fact in all the main streets
- An improved retail service. Especially in clothing and footwear
- A concealed sign would be sensible at the junction where the road from the station leads into Park Street - an accident waiting to happen
- Affordable long stay parking for commuters (I am not one), still too many cars being parked in & around the station streets. New yellow lines in places. Just moving up a bit or into private parking.
- Provide more parking off-road for Catholic Church in Priory Road - it's extremely dangerous to drive past it on Sunday mornings
- Replace the old open air swimming pool
Replace /open a cinema
Improved skate park and enlarge basketball court to full size
- Coffee shop in High Street
- Existing facilities need to be maintained and not closed down
Rail service needs improving, less services stopping at Hungerford i.e. to get to the West Country
- Most things not open on Sundays and BH's (Tourism potential)
- More restaurants, less charity shops and antique shops.
Perhaps some chain restaurants which are competitively priced and family friendly - Starbucks, Pizza Express etc
- Free parking for all at all times
- Invite Gifford's Circus (who are brilliant) to the Common.
Use the Common more for community events, outdoor theatre, concerts, beer festivals, jazz etc. Events will attract people
- Traffic lights on crossings to speed up traffic and allow pedestrians to cross together
- The telephone kiosk outside the P.O. Sorting Office is a potential road hazard, it obstructs visibility of people about to cross east to west for drivers approaching from Town Hall direction.
There is ample room for it to be re-sited on the other side of the road, near Post Office
- More seating throughout High Street & The Croft



- Better / more parking as many spaces taken by out of town train travellers
Museum
- More good quality mid cost eating places e.g. Ask / Café Uno
- Attract more businesses into empty shops - more variety
Either build the marina or turn it back to nature
- Visual policing - adds to a community & feel safer
Clean, well supervised / maintained toilets and the opening of a delightful tearoom suitable for locals & tourists
- More youth facilities
More events to get people of town together
- Decent fairly priced restaurants
- Cycle paths which enable parents & small children to ride their bikes safely i.e. the common or tow path Hungerford to Kintbury incl
Roller Blading users too
Keep Ladybugs running - Toddler group at the Youth Club
- More restrictions on late night licences i.e. Railway Tavern & visible policing around Priory Road esp around closing times
- More fast trains to London
- Improve bus service, I would willingly leave my car at home & use public transport into Newbury
- Free Parking
- More things for young disabled
- Maintain the station car park, West Berks entrance to Hungerford from the car park - needs to be enhanced - keeps The Cuttings clean & tidy
- More public toilets needed even introducing "Tardis" self cleaning style toilets which charge
- Reduce speed in Fairview Road to 20mph (down hill of Hungerford Primary)
It is presently very dangerous in both directions
- The frontage of the Town Hall / Corn Exchange could be improved
- A first class bakers - opened early
- Regular clothes and shoes shop
HMV type shop
- Toilet facilities more prominently displayed
Bus / coach drop off point should have toilet facilities nearby
- More facilities to leave pets (dogs) outside of local shops
- Vacant shops filled with wider range of shops. The Angel pub should be offered as a community pub catering for everyone
- More family shops (affordable prices!)
- An effective library, present one has almost no books!
- Tesco's to have a different exit route for customer cars - out the back would improve congestion of the High Street and flow



- A recognised bus stop outside 'Cryers' in the High Street with seating, especially for elderly people with shopping
- Before considering speed reactive signs, brown signs etc, tidy the clutter of signs in the Town. You can have too much information!
- Street cafes & more individual shops to make Hungerford a more attractive town to visit
- Do not have empty shops in town whereby landlords to reduce rent to allow business to flourish and pay expenses
- Golf course provision - Flower decoration in the Town - closer watch on vandalism and anti-social behaviour e.g. at railway station
- Upgrade of all CCTV units
- Baker, cobbler, dry cleaner (could be allied with training)
Real railway station (shelter for 'us' passengers waiting)
Buses to Oxford & Salisbury
- Costa Coffee or Starbucks
A nice French restaurant
- Install a weight limit on the canal bridge to stop enormous lorries using the High Street
- The gas pipeline extended to all houses
- Encourage business into empty retail units in High Street perhaps rents lowered to encourage potential clients.
Improvement made to business areas on Bath Road etc to improve appearance & encourage people to visit the town.
More competition for present retailers could mean more people shopping in the town full stop
- Improvements to Hungerford Station, bigger or more shelter
- A affordable shoe shop - CD/DVD outlet
- More places to sit outside - few more benches
- Less vacant shops - too many now have 'To Let' signs!
Look at ways of encouraging new business into town - reduce rates etc - need more eating outlets especially family ones
- More independent food shops e.g. delicatessen, proper bakers and restaurants such as Pizza Express or Brasserie Gerard, La Tosca rather than low quality takeaways
- Encourage & maintain existing services, any reductions will only impinge on the elderly & disabled benefiting a good quality of life
- Better parking at railway station for locals
- Better transport links (more regular, more choice)
- As newcomers we would just love to see the town make the most of the potential as a lovely place for visitors to come to enjoy and relax in. Possibly also encourage small independent traders to open interesting and unusual shops to attract visitors
- More coffee places
- Decent restaurant would be nice



- Cycling routes from housing areas into town.
More consideration for the people who live here instead of just looking after businesses
- A child friendly restaurant
A soft-play centre
Children's playground at northern end of Hungerford
- The new footbridge a.s.a.p.
Demolish that derelict building opposite 'The Forge' what a first eye sight!!
- A play area for children in The Croft (swings and slides)
- Definitely more coffee shops, restaurants that are family friendly and give a greater range
- Re-open youth centre and have more after school activities for children
- More playing space for children aged 3-16
Disincentives to drive into town (promote cycling / walking)
I love the idea of a community orchard - why not on the common and other open spaces
- Ambulance station should be with fire station
- Hanging baskets and plants around the Town Hall and High Street
- More accessible public toilets with direction signs
- More mid-range restaurants
Mid week evening social activities e.g ceroc / modern jive etc
- Entrance by road to Hungerford from Newbury & Marlborough does not reflect the character of the town - both garages and BMW are an eyesore. Planting of trees to hide these and other businesses along the A4 might help. People passing along A4 would not know that the town is so nice.
- More police on the beat
Housing for locals (young adults born / grown up here)
- Picnic benches & floral planting by the bridge / canal
- Stop youths speed cycling on walkways and pavements.
Catch regular 'thieves'!
Stop idle layabouts claiming state benefits
- Restricted parking (single yellow lines) in residential streets within 1 mile of the town centre to prevent commuters from Marlborough etc using Hungerford as a free car park for the station
- An unloading bay outside the Co-op
- Discourage heavy lorries, bridge not wide enough and can be damaged
- Speed up the building of the new pedestrian footbridge

- More buses into Newbury

- To have free parking and more of it at the station. To make the pavement narrow so we could have more parking like it was. We need a cinema
- High Street parking causes more traffic congestion, remove and widen paths and put in more shrubs & trees. There is parking nearby which could be used more - near library and train station. Reduce number of antique shops
- More supermarkets and get rid of parking wardens
- Improve canal pathways
- Better late night train services from London
- Free parking for 30mins this will undoubtedly increase local business
- New soft play area - more general public swim times - some form of Theatre Arts Centre
- Social clubs for 25-55's
- Out of town parking in walking distance. More public conveniences
More cafes and restaurants with better opening hours
- A decent bakery
- Cleaning up dog mess
- I would like the delivery traffic made to adhere to the times allocated.
If you ask them to move enable to park they refuse or they park on the street and cause hold-ups. There doesn't seem the police take no action
- A museum
- Youth clubs to keep teenagers off street. Encourage more companies to start up here. We need an ambulance based here.
- Traffic lights on pedestrian crossing
- More police about at night when all the kids decide to shout about at 2 and 3 o'clock in the morning on their way home
- Change Church Way into a one way street
- Encourage localism and keep the existing town spirit
- Better ways of managing traffic in the High Street
- Disabled access i.e. dropped kerbs etc
- Somewhere for the youth to go other than school or church activities
- Install double yellow lines / no parking outside John O'Gaunt College between both entrances given dangers with traffic particularly at school times
- The Wednesday market should be improved or abolished
- Coffee Bar with street seating. Much better station facilities. Redevelopment of the whole station area. Possibly second storey parking in car park by railway opposite side of road to railway tavern
- Allow pubs etc to create a café culture within reason to make us more family friendly and welcoming
- Shops that are open and selling things of interest to ordinary consumers.
Perhaps rates in High Street need to be looked at to encourage commerce



- Better doctors surgery
Area for the younger children in the skate park as the younger children can't use it as the ramps area too big and the older children are too fast / big
- A pedestrian / traffic light by the crossing road to station - a hazard every morning and evening
- Continue the footpath from Howard's Pet Shop around the bend on the left hand side into North View.
Remove vegetation and shave off the bank to make visibility better when driving out of North View into Fairview Road
- More restaurants!! Better Shops!! We are fed up going to Newbury just to get a value for money evening. Hungerford Pubs TOO EXPENSIVE
- Clean and modern Bistro / café with good quality food / deli. Poor choice just now. Preferably not a chain!! Good service!
- The Lamb (R.I.P.) & Casanova's (R.I.P.) buildings filled with independent restaurants ASAP
- Better maintenance of pavements and roads. A pedestrian crossing at top of High Street
A large town map outside Corn Exchange / Town Hall
- Somewhere to have tea - a special tea shop. A restaurant within most people's budget - Pizza Hut type. Children's clothes shop
- Street Cafes, wi-fi, bike racks. 30 mins free parking at Library. Resident's parking permits
Motor home parking facilities near station
- More use of the canal. More dentists, for children especially
- More cafes and shops and restaurants. Tables and chairs outside the restaurants
better schools
- Cinema. More restaurants. Improve buildings to High Street (very downward looking)
- A decent youth group that young people want to use
- Speed calming in Priory Ave
- More shops
- More youth facilities for teenagers, litter around the station.
Develop something on the site by the station or make it available for long term parking
- Some form of measure to slow traffic in Church Street.
The exit from Church way into Church Street is dangerous - traffic from the west of Hungerford housing estate is heavy and too fast. An accident waiting to happen
- More things for baby's i.e. NCT sales Town Hall, make public about thing that going on in the town
- Move the zebra crossing up closer to Tesco's
- Fully staffed police station open 24/7. Community hospital. A family friendly leisure club
- A new 'old' facelift to the High Street - Bridge Street
Better connecting footpaths in town between communities, as pedestrian routes
- Improve access to shops by reducing / cancelling parking charges. Improve opportunities for independent retailers



- Wildflower strips in public grass areas like Canal Walk, Atherton Crescent, The Croft Meeting place with fruit of nut trees and benches outside the Town Hall in place of the car parking
- I would like to see a greater police presence and cannot recall the last time I saw a constable / special in the residential areas and only occasionally in the High Street
- Better public toilets, car parks in north of town, restaurants / cafes, permanent taxi rank at station
- Need pavement on all of Park Street. Litter generally not a problem, but dog fouling is
- Having recently moved from Essex, I am a bit disappointed with the recycling here, i.e. not being able to recycle more plastic, aluminium foil etc
- We would like to see a cheap chain restaurant for families e.g. Pizza Hut or Wetherspoons etc. Also a bigger variety of shops
- Some form of community / youth project linked to the Youth Club to engage younger members of Hungerford
- Parking
- I'd like to see all the shops occupied. I'm sure if some of the landlords reduced the rental prices then it would help.
- Park Street / Fairview Road / Station Road junction to be improved in the interest of safety. It is stupid not to have a continuous pavement on the w.side of Station Road.
- A hydropool for the elderly and disabled.
- New Toilets
- Cobbles to be removed - Tarmac surfaces instead.
- More Restaurants
- Increase Police presence at bottom of Tarrant's Hill where drug dealing is common place on a Fri/Sat night.
- Traffic diverted through Charnham Park rather than Bridge Street/High Street. As a resident in this area the traffic noise and pollution is very disruptive.
- I would not let any more shops like Paribel into Hungerford.

Policing: Policing in the town is all but invisible. Nothing in the town plan can influence the Policing plan which is formulated in Kidlington by TVP. PCSOs have been posted to Hungerford (in lieu of trained Police Officers) and they are supposed to be Visible, and by visible I mean patrolling the street. This does not happen and there is no sign it will ever happen. This is all down to good or bad leadership. I'm afraid the leadership at ground level is all but non-existent.
In order to improve Police Visibility my suggestion is that there should be a major move by the Town Plan and local councillors to ask TVP to close Hungerford Police Station as it stands and relocate it to a "shop" in the high street. The police station at the moment is not fit for purpose and is too big for the small number of officers that operate from it. TVP should sell it off and use the proceeds to relocate as described. They have done it elsewhere, Hungerford will fit the bill. If this happens it will mean the staff that work here will be in the public eye on a daily basis, and not hidden in "The House on the Hill".



In addition if the premises in the high street is used to could be utilised by other workers that "patrol" such as traffic wardens employed by the council. (Who knows they might talk to each other and exchange information).

One of the reasons why the police would oppose a move like this is parking. If that the case the parish council should sort it out.

Another suggestion would be to investigate the use of neighbourhood wardens that have successfully been used elsewhere in West Berkshire (this would assist with Number 6 regarding the town appearance). Again these units are only as good as whoever is in charge. If neighbourhood wardens are utilised they too could operate from the Police office, as they do from Newbury, Thatcham and Pangbourne Police Stations.

Town Museum: This town lacks what could be a tourist attraction and that is a Town museum. Well aware of problems that come from that, buildings/location and later staffing etc, but it could go into the system as a suggestion.

Regarding the general look of the town I suggest that there be some sort of liaison with British Rail (or whoever they are) and sort out the look of the railway bridge. Whilst this is a major piece of engineering there is no reason why it should not be painted so that it fits with the surroundings bearing in mind it is a major feature in the town centre. Consideration should be given as part of this process to getting a large "sign" if that the right word with the town crest and have it fixed dead centre on both sides of the newly painted bridge.

- Parking has improved for commuters and they don't shop in Hungerford! We find it harder to find a space but will continue to battle against the odds. It will be a miracle if Hungerford services the debacle of the roadworks.
- More shops, restaurants and cafes that will attract people to the town. More chain brands! Dodds building needs renovating it's disgusting!
- Remove all car parking outside Town Hall. The whole area could then be widened up for buses and coaches only. They would then be able to negotiate their parking more safely. At times this area is a nightmare.
- Tarmac path by river in between Eddington and the Total garage. It's very uneven with loose stones - dangerous. A central playground for children of all ages.
A new/improved multi-purpose community building to be used by all ie: children's clubs, youth groups, social evening for all ages - one place, central, accessible with parking.
- Speed ramps in Fairview Road.
- Increase enforcement of road traffic and parking regulations.
- Improve road gritting and pavements during snow/ice conditions. Church Way/Chilton Way.
- Better signage and enforcement of pedestrian crossing on A4 Nr Texaco Garage - possible to convert to lights.
- Bypass for Salisbury Road from A4 via common. New bridges or bridge over river.
River / Canal/ Railway going through to Sanum Green.
- Internet café and café open evenings. Children's clothes and shoe retail.



- Potholes fixed - Church Way to beyond the legion seen to. Stupidly and dangerous yellow lines.
- Better rail services to London. More new housing.
- Park Street: Speed reactive signs / police speed camera on occasions. Traffic warden/parking patrols.
- Limited free parking.
- More and better public lavatories - I am always being asked for the existing facilities and am ashamed of them.
- Visible police presence. It is not acceptable that it takes too long for police officers to arrive here when needed. They need to be based here!
- Covered shelters for children to congregate and sit in shelter from weather.
- Resumption of buses to Marlborough via Shalbourne (ie: stopping at top end of town) at sensible times and the facility to request buses from Froxfield to go to Priory Road.
- I would like to see signs on all the mini roundabouts telling motorists to give way to vehicles from the right as I have many times almost had accidents caused by drivers who don't know this is part of the Highway Code.
- Improve road condition, better policing at night.
- Better range of shops and cafes and restaurants.
Would like for all something like a Costa coffee or pizza express on High Street.
- I live on the edge of Charnham Park - any policing, speed traps, cameras along that stretch would be welcome. HGVs parking up in early hours of the morning with engines running too.
- Access to free tennis courts or reduced prices for residents of Hungerford.
- Improve provision for children at the swimming pool - family changing rooms, small pool.
Re-open the youth club.
Improve the web site which looks very dated.
Repair all the potholes.
Decorate empty shops so they don't look deserted and dirty.
Better plastics recycling.
- Try and get some volunteers to man a OAP Help point, say in the library meeting room, to assist with form filling to ensure they get what they are entitled to.
- An outdoor swimming pool.
- A purpose built theatre, or improved facilities, or the Town Hall.
- Affordable restaurants.
Child friendly coffee shop - Costa / starbucks.
- People should be encouraged to walk more - this could be started at school level. If more people walked they would more likely use local shops and traffic problems would be reduced. For a small town the distance people drive is unnecessary!
- Better eating houses.
- More policing around the neighbourhood. More activities for the elderly.
- A few seats on common and canal sides.
- Free parking on weekdays for local businesses.



- Anti social behaviour not being policed.
No more low cost housing should be built as unfortunately low cost housing goes hand-in-hand with anti social behaviour which is currently a problem.
- A café which is child friendly and push chair friendly. Open library more often - Sunday.
- Speed restrictions in town of 20 miles p/h.
- Bridge pavement levelled and made pedestrian friendly.
- 20 mph speed limit Fairview road.
Improved pavement and traffic calming nr Park Street and Fairview Junction.
Improve train station.
Tackle dog excrement on marsh, common and canal.
Make the croft a focal point.
- We need proper shops so that locals do not have to travel out of town.
- Free short term (30 min) parking.
Property maintenance - Altheas/Dodds/Barr's Yard redevelopment and co-op office/store.
- Speed reduction measures in the high street.
More aggressive parking patrols. Less blinkered planners in the town council.
- Roundabout at the Tesco's junction.
Family friendly restaurants - maybe with play equipment in the gardens of these establishments.
- The reopening of Casanovas and The Lamb.
A café / coffee house that is accessible and welcoming to younger age groups - possibly a national chain that younger age groups are familiar with!
- Roads are in v poor condition. Entrance from South (Salisbury Road) needs to be improved (Grass areas). Land in front of Crescent made like an attractive recreational area. Walk areas ie: A4 (path) nr Vet across Kennet river to town.
- A bus service all the way up to Penny Farthing Close.
- Performing arts centre.
Test path in Tesco car park for the London bound platform.
- To see the police come out of Park Street and walk through town and see residents - residents like to see them!
More tourist friendly signs and less traffic and roadworks.
- Pubs and hotels allowed pavement searing (like Marlborough)
- More options in terms of places to go for breakfast/during the day for lunch - cafes etc, which are affordable!
- Reduce car parking on parkway, Fairview, etc. The single lane traffic can be a nightmare. Provide off road car parking in free designated areas for residents.
- A fast food restaurant, eg Macdonalds.
- Would be nice to bring the ambulance station back and have full time staff in the police station.
- One way system in Fairview road from park street to the one stop shop, including speed ramps, will make it safer all round and easier to park.
- Fines for dog mess - especially along pound piece etc.



- More affordable shops (not antique shops!)
- More facilities for the arts. Designated arts centre with multi purpose performance space.
- Paint the railway bridge over A338, its revolting and hasn't been painted in 13 years! - Not brown please.
Paint black and white railing on Kennet Bridge - ditto above.
- More restriction of on-street parking. The roads and verges are littered with vehicles and owners should be made aware that roads are for the passage of vehicles and not somewhere convenient to park.
- Free short term parking - 15 or 20 minutes to help local shops.
- A mini M&S (not food) in the large shop on the corner by Tesco.
A larger, less cramped Boots.
A disabled and elderly friendly taxi service.
- More bins on tow path and at points on marsh/common.
LED street lamps.
- Better short term free parking on high street.
- Public toilets to a good standard and sign posted.
- Improved bus services to Swindon, Marlborough etc.
More toilets (public), eg near A4.
- A Wilkinson's. I think we have too much of the same type of expensive shops.
- Cycle ways, canoe hire on the canal.
- As an old person I am very happy with the facilities and care already in force. However, I think this question is more application to younger people who will have lots of ideas.
- Make better use of the wide footways.
- Late opening night for high street shops.
- More car parking at station.
- Residence only parking (Atherton crescent) therefore more free parking.
- Pizza chain restaurant, family friendly, accessible restaurants.
More activities for teenagers and publicise these.
Less traffic driving through.
- Need a train to the West Country in the morning - like the 09:21.
Publish a walk around Hungerford book describing itemised places of interest.
- When we first moved here 26 years ago there was a weekly summer auction in the corn exchange where people who grew flowers, fruit or veg, or kept chickens could sell their excess produce. This was a wonderful way of buying very fresh local produce and was a good way of bringing local people together. Could it not be reinstated?
If marsh north of canal was named a nature reserve this would give it added status and be another attraction for visitors.
- More regular bus service.
- Cycle track round common.
- Museum



- Improvements in the facades of certain businesses in Bridge Street and High Street. A delicatessen. Pavement Café. More trees in the main street. Cleaner railway bridge. Less parking on High Street.
- More clothing shops selling affordable clothes especially for teenagers.
- Centralised point at railway station for trains, buses and taxis.
- Corn exchange entrance - clean, refurbish steps and benches, frontage etc. High street shop fronts - many are dirty chipped paint work. Need light, bright paintwork, attractive to customers especially in winter.
- Allow continental style cafes to give good relaxed friendly atmosphere of town. Existing town centre seats to face each other, not into buildings.
- Quality food shop eg Deli. Sort out derelict shop in Bridge Street. Bakery (for bread). Clear up area around station. Fewer charity shops (ie: no more).
- Affordable clothes and shoes shops for adults and children.
- More facilities for younger people.
- CCTV Bulpit lane - priory ave, crossroads. It will cover path to two schools, football club, the litterbugs and street drinkers. Solar powered street lighting.
- Pedestrian crossing in church street to town high street.

- Family-friendly place to eat like Pizza Express and Ask. Outdoor seating by 3 Swans would create good atmosphere.
- Pavement cafes

- Abolish Church St parking and make pavements level. Plan and monitor any future roadworks.
- Direct footpath from Charnham Park to town centre so I could walk into town. Too far to go all the way round.
- More public toilets. Pavement benches for sitting
- More varied selection of shops
- It would be valuable to have a community Arts Centre
- Affordable shoes and clothing shops for those who have no transport to go to bigger towns
- More encouragement for individual shops
- More eating places, eg cafes or restaurants. Hungerford needs to move with the times
- Definitely more pushchair-friendly establishments. There are steps everywhere.
- Closer involvement in Youth Group by all the town and Council
- Shop fronts in High Street to be in character with town architecture. Reduce large glass shop fronts.
- Better bus information and bus station at railway station. Ditto taxis - the taxi parking in the High Street is usually empty and a waste of parking.
- Summer activity - develop HADCAF into a major weekend festival (food & beer?) like Marlborough Jazz Festival - multi venue programme. Free parking on common (subject to Town & Manor). Canal festival. Agricultural / countryside skills activity fair.
- Better recycling, green waste, plastics, metals locally.
- Improved public toilets
- A theatre, better selection of shops within clothing, technology and media (music/film)
- Cheaper and wider variety of shops (ie shops similar to Primark, Shoe Zone and Mothercare). More restaurants (ie Italian, Spanish, French, Thai). A launderette is also needed.
- Additional shopping mall or supermarket
- More restaurants, independent shops and stores. Important to retain Hungerford's character and charm.
- More convenient bus services. Bigger library. Greater number of town maps including places of interest on show in town with 'you are here'.
- Reasonably priced clothes and shoe shops. More restaurants.
- Install lights at the pedestrian crossing near the Post Office. This might mean pedestrians waiting a short time to cross the road but would eliminate such long waits causing traffic hold-ups.

- More restaurants to choose from. Current restaurants are complacent as they do not have direct competition ie Chippy!
- More cafes and restaurants in the High Street. Particularly between the canal and the railway bridge.
- An additional supermarket on the outskirts.
- Hungerford is a lovely town. We just need to keep all the shops open and keep High Street congestion to a minimum.
- Staffed station and waiting room / information area. Better pathway by Tavern. Would the proposed new hotel be better as parking?
- More free parking. Signage on A4 to "Town Centre". Make more of town as a tourist destination. Reduced non-domestic rates to help shops and businesses.
- A local recycling centre; A cinema; A boxing centre.
- Independent shops - park and ride. More flowers in town centre.
- Encourage people to use the library. I keep forgetting it's there. Events or activities to draw new people to it.

- More affordable housing for poor people like me who have no choice but to waste money renting!! This can be done without spoiling countryside such as Cottrell Close and Kennedy Meadow

- Outside the schools should be no cars between 8:15 - 9:15 and 2:30 - 3:45. Traffic is a major issue outside the Primary School - an accident waiting to happen
- Traffic flow around Tesco on a Saturday
- More facilities for teens and young adults
- Empty shops not allowed to be neglected and become eyesores in the town
- Encourage use of the weekly market by removing the costs for stallholders. Have a monthly antiques market in the street. Encourage the return of the French market
- Larger, more fully stocked Co-op
- Less antique shops and more shops selling useful products we all actually need every week
- Pavements to be more level
- Would like to see more roads & pavements resurfaced eg Church Way and Homefield Way
- Any major development should be north side of town, at least workers could go north to M4, Newbury or Swindon. Town would not take more traffic at peak times.



- Presence of more police on the streets and stop vandalism, drinking and drug taking under pedestrian canal bridge at the bottom of Station Road
- A quiet area surrounded by flowers and seats (garden)
- Picnic areas on the Marsh or at least more benches
- Improved shopping facilities i.e. Competition to Tesco. Town lacks restaurants other than pubs and takeaways
- More use of the Common for local activities at reasonable prices
- Cafe service at tables on pavements, as in Marlborough & Newbury
- Improvement to healthcare services for hospitals, clinics and surgery visits for people with no transport
- More selection of shops (no more antique shops) Bridge St derelict area to be improved as it looks like a dump
- Enforcement to stop on road parking in residential areas
- Family friendly restaurants, more for youth, more for children
- Half hour parking for post office and library
- Would benefit from having one or two cafe's staying open in summer after 5pm. Extension of minibus service to Mon - Fri particularly in winter with a minimal charge
- McDonalds, KFC - fast food restaurants, this would encourage people to visit Hungerford
- Make more use of the Common for community events eg car boot sales (reuse, recycle), vintage rally etc
- Dedicated theatre with storage and rehearsal space with charges economical enough to include all local groups
- Speed limit on Church Street. Increased library opening hours. Encourage more National Express coaches to stop here.
- A modern shop for sensible clothing
- Support for children and youth services - clubs, venues etc
- Improved leisure centre with increased variety of sports. Wider variety of shops.
- Provide spaces for coaches - could be outside Hungerford. Disabled parking should be on Boots / bank side. Car parking in Bridge St area - move cenotaph to the Croft to create parking or behind John O'Gaunt. Keep character of Hungerford. Look after Rod Desmuelles - Christmas lights and flowers must not be lost. The approaches to Hungerford should be made more attractive, flowers and interesting trees, artwork on roundabouts. Move office from station area to Charnham Park - create low cost housing for over 50s in existing area.
- Internet cafe for teenage / youth groups
- Please don't divert A4 past Charnham Park / Kennet Way
- Remove car parking outside Co-op at delivery times. Lorries on the High Street, parked helps nobody.
- Better wheel chair friendly pavements and more thought about dropped curbs
- Tidy up signage on street view level
- Controlled crossings in the High Street



- Divert traffic on the A4 via Charnham Park as this would create more of a community feel in Charnham Street and most importantly increase pedestrian safety and congestion in the town.
- Tourist information signs. 2nd ticket machine at railway station.
- Library to function as main info centre for tourist info, B&B/local accommodation and camping provision, youth clubs / activities/orgs info as well as other clubs & organisations. This should be part of the library staff's normal job.
- A decent restaurant
- IT training facilities in town centre
- Launderette, an arts centre for more HADCAF type events
- Better signage to inform people of parking in the High St. New shops - agree to one or two chain stores.
- Main road through tarmaced properly after all the recent roadworks and digging up. Move phone box so drivers have view of crossing. Seating in High St and pavement cafes - encourage tourists and residents to enjoy the ambiance. Enjoy being in the town and spend time in it.
- Better zebra crossings in Tesco Car Park.
- Affordable adult and children's clothing & shoes etc.
Evening and Sunday Bus Services - certainly not a decrease in public transport which I fear will happen.
Keep the local library.
Maintain healthy local NHS and Social Care Services and not a decrease in these services.
- More at the skate park for the children, and Police check ups up there.
Pot holes filled in.
- More activities for children.
Coffee bar open in evenings, not just Pubs to go to.
- More signposted walking routes.
Make the town more dog friendly, loads of us have dogs.
- A coach park to enable more visitors to come and enjoy our lovely town.
- More relevant shops. Too many card shops! More food shops, ie: a bakery.
- More for youngsters to do in the evenings.
- Construction of a theatre type building to compliment the high level of performing arts in the community.
- Larger café in high street.
- Wider variety of shops (enough card shops, gift shops!).
Half hour / 15 mins free parking on the high street.
A really good family pub with play park / garden like Cavern Arms.
- A leaflets for walks in the immediate surroundings.
More dog bins, particularly on the canal paths.
- The recent gasworks fiasco highlight the obvious problem with road access to Hungerford. If the canal bridge was damaged the town would be cut off.
- Better Policing - at the moment it appears to be zero!



- Church Road pedestrian crossings and speed limit.
Much better secondary school.
- Try to ensure residents of Eddington/North Hungerford can safely walk into Hungerford and safely cross the number of roads needed to make sure they can use the new footbridge across the canal (How to safely cross Bridge Street, esp with a pushchair?)
- Banking on a Saturday.
Hardware store.
- Resurfacing of roads.
- Improve paths along the canal for calking, cycling, disabled. Suggest cycle route to attract tourists.
- Many of the kids aged between 8-13 use the leisure centre, which is good but maybe more than swimming on offer to them. Is there any youth centre?
- More car parks. No parking on side of high street. More parking by surgery and nursery school.
- More community police presence.
Tourist signs would be a great help for visitors.
The community orchard would be a wonderful idea.
- A better taxi rank
- Some more places for young adults to socialise; perhaps a wine/cocktail bar and a gastro pub or 2.
- A coffee / small bar for teenagers, which is open till late at night to help keep them off the streets.
Some different shops other than antiques, eg: clothes shop, baby and children clothes affordable.
- Crossing installed for Bearwater
- Charges for any on street car parking, whilst having designated car parks for free (or free up to a certain time).
More through trains to the west country.
Encouragements for (subsidies for) buses - would like a bus service to Salisbury.
More / Weekly farmers markets!
- Museum
- Pedestrianised area outside the town hall where seating can be placed for an outside café.
More cafes and bars for young adults (below 60!).
More entertainment facilities for the younger popular of Hungerford.
To encourage more relevant shops in the town that would attract people from outside the area too ie: more well known brands.
Improve the visual aspects of the shops by the canal bridge, and other empty units!
Encourage bars and restaurants to provide entertainment of a Sunday evening as the town is dead... Plume of Feathers closed! John o Gaunt Pub locked out for Quiz!
Summer event (like Victorian Extravaganza) to encourage visitors to the town.
Improve the pavements and road surfaces.
More live bands on Fri, Sat and Sunday nights. Encourage Local bands/groups/youth to play.



Better use of the Town Hall and Corn Exchange facilities for concerts, plays, community events etc (not rug or shoe sales!).

Get rid of the eyesore that is the Kebab Van... why is it needed now we have a great Kebab House.

More diverse restaurants, such as a decent Chinese.

Less card and charity shops.

More visible policing that are interacting with the community day and night.
